

Lawn Care Schedule

January - Beginning a new year is a great time to start cleaning up the yard. Prepare your yard for new spring growth that is near.

March - Rake grass lightly to stand up blades. Apply Pre-emergent herbicide to prevent and control weeds.

April - Loosen and compact the soil by core aerating. Add soil amendments and compost. Compost improves the structure and texture of the soil enabling it to better retain nutrients, moisture, and air for the betterment of plants.

May - It is a Great Time to Fertilize! Make sure to fertilize evenly.

June - Apply Post-emergent herbicide to eliminate nasty new weeds.

Aug/Sept - It's that time again! Fertilize. Top grass about 1/4" with compost. You will need to core aerate if compaction is an issue. (Also recommended for customers with fescue & rye grasses to over-seed, following a hot summer.)

October – This is a good time to apply Nitrons (soil conditioners) if soil compaction is an issue and you did not aerate. You may also fertilize again or wait to apply in November.

November - Last Fertilizing for the Year! Helps maintain good winter color. Good for nutrition the grass stores and utilizes to carry through until you fertilize in May for the growing season of spring.
